Incoming traditional and adult transfer students, with between 1 and 27 credits	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> who <u>do not have</u> an approved foundation seminar course from an accredited institution, will be required to take the foundation seminar course, CORE 115 Common Ground.
Incoming traditional and adult transfer students, with between 1 and 27 credits	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <u>who have</u> transferred an approved foundation seminar course from an accredited institution, will not be required to take the foundation seminar course, CORE 115 Common Ground.
Incoming traditional and adult transfer students with more than 27 credits	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <u>will not</u> be required to take the foundation seminar course, CORE 115 Common Ground, formerly known as IDS 100. Students who end with fewer than the required number of core credit hours will make up the deficiency by taking courses approved for the core until they accumulate a minimum of 46 credit hours in the core.
All incoming traditional, adult, traditional transfer and adult transfer students	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <u>will be</u> required to take Justice & the Common Good course, Experiential Learning, and the Core Capstone
